This document is important for you to keep since it is the only way you will have to refer to your particular case number. If you need a copy of your police report, it can be obtained from the NLVPD Records Division, 1301 E. Lake Mead Boulevard, 72 HOURS AFTER filing the report, for a nominal fee. For additional information you may visit the web site at www.cityofnorthlasvegas.com/departments/police/recordsdivision.shtm. **If you need to file additional information, you may contact the CSO's office at 633-1738 or 633-1017 ext: 5110 for hours of operation.** Whether or not a follow-up investigator is assigned to the case depends on certain factors assessed from the initial investigation. Experience has proven that certain information and evidence must be gathered in the initial stages of an investigation. Without critical information about suspects, witnesses, and evidence or other investigative leads it might be difficult to solve the case except under special circumstances such as finding crucial evidence or obtaining a confession from a suspect.

- This report will be forwarded to the City Attorney's Office for prosecutorial merit. To determine the status of your case, contact the City Attorney's Office one week following the date of this report at 633-2100.
- This case will be investigated further by the Detective Bureau. If you have questions or additional information, call the Detective Bureau at 633-1773.
- A continuing investigation would not be productive at this time due to lack of investigative leads. If additional information becomes available at a later date, the department may assign an investigator. Despite the fact that this case will not be part of a continuing investigation, it will be part of our permanent records and will be reviewed automatically for crime analysis.

NORTH LAS VEGAS CITY ATTORNEY OFFICE - VICTIM/WITNESS ASSISTANCE: Provides case status updates, information about victims' rights, court accompaniment, assistance to apply for Nevada Victims' of Crime Compensation, VAWA immigration information, and referrals to other community services. VICTIM INFORMATION and NOTIFICATION EVERYDAY (VINE) - The VINE automated notification system provides victims, citizens, or other concerned parties with updates of an offender's change in custody; 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. CLARK COUNTRY DISTRICT ATTORNEY VICTIM/WITNESS ASSISTANCE CENTER: Provides Justice Court and District Court case information and ASSISTANCE FOR VICTIMS OF SEXUAL ASSAULT with medical treatment and counseling needs, under NRS 217.280. Please contact the Victim Witness Assistance Center at 671-2525 regarding any concerns you may have. If you receive a subpoena to appear, in a Justice Court or District Court case, or if your address changes, please contact the Victim Witness Assistance Center at 671-2525.

COMPENSATION FOR VICTIMS OF VIOLENT CRIME: Victims of violent crime may qualify for monetary compensation from the State of Nevada under NRS 217.010. For information, contact the NLVPD Victim/witness Advocate or the Nevada State Victims of Violent Crime Compensation Program at 486-2740. Note: Application for this service must be received within one year of the commission of the crime.

PROTECTION OF VICTIMS AND WITNESSES RIGHTS: Victims/witnesses of crime are entitled to certain right under NRS 178.569 (i.e. investigation of threats of harm, notice of releases of a defendant upon written request, a listing of property being held by a law enforcement agency, etc.). For information concerning these rights, you may contact the Victim Assistance Office at 633-1017 ext. 5084 or 633-1751.

- OBLIGATIONS OF CITIZENS FILING MISDEMEANOR CRIME REPORT WITH NLVPD**
1. It is imperative that you update your address and phone number if you move, regardless of the status of your case, by calling 633-2100.
 2. If a trial is necessary, you must be available to testify.
 3. The police report number appears at the top of this page. You must provide that number when you contact the City Attorney, District Attorney or the Detective assigned to your case.
