3. APPEAL, SUBMITTED BY ROBERT GRONAUER, OF THE PLANNING COMMISSION'S DECISION TO DENY AMP-27-00 (LONE MOUNTAIN/DECATUR); AN APPLICATION SUBMITTED BY DAYSIDE, INC. ON BEHALF OF JAMES H. BILBRAY FAMILY TRUST, TO CHANGE THE COMPREHENSIVE PLAN FROM OFFICE TO NEIGHBORHOOD COMMERCIAL, FOR PROPERTY LOCATED AT THE NORTHEAST CORNER OF LONE MOUNTAIN ROAD AND DECATUR BOULEVARD. (ASSOCIATED ITEMS ZN-37-00, NO. 4; AMP-28-00, NO. 6; ZN-38-00, NO. 5)

Mayor Montandon opened the Public Hearing.

Development Services Director Tom Bell explained at the August 8, 2001 meeting, the Planning Commission denied the recommendation of approval for AMP-27-00. The primary concern of the Commission and staff was that the proposed Amendment to the Master Plan did not conform to the guidelines. Specifically, the market study did not support the commercial use, nor was it located at the intersection of two one hundred foot rights-of-way. Therefore, staff recommended that Council reaffirm the Planning Commission's decision and deny the application.

Robert Gronauer, 3800 Howard Hughes Parkway, Las Vegas, represented the applicant and the property owners and stated the applications had been in the City's system for quite awhile. Mr. Gronauer explained the proposed project was located at the corner of Lone Mountain Road and Decatur Boulevard. Lone Mountain Road was a 90 foot right of way and Decatur Boulevard was a major arterial street planned to be 100 foot in width. Further to the north of the property was the proposed northern section of the beltway. Mr. Gronauer felt the opening of that section of the beltway would create increased traffic in the area.

Mr. Gronauer stated the property was currently master planned for office and commercial uses on 15 acres of the subject property. Approximately one year ago, the first application was presented to the Planning Commission. The application requested a mixed use commercial and multi-family development. More specifically, the corner of the property was proposed for neighborhood commercial zoning with multi-family on the rest of the parcel at approximately 14 units per acre. However, there were several residents at the Planning Commission meeting who opposed the multi-family portion of the project. Mr. Gronauer explained several meetings had taken place with the neighbors in the area to address their concerns and issues. When the item came before Council, the applicant requested the item be referred back to the Planning Commission because they wished to revise their plan with regard to the boundary lines for the residential and commercial areas.

Mr. Gronauer explained the new plan proposed neighborhood commercial, or C-1 zoning, on the frontage of Decatur and a portion of Lone Mountain Road. The back portion, which consisted of approximately six acres, was proposed to be medium density, or R-2 zoning. The meetings with the neighbors resulted in an agreement that the back portion on the east of the project would be developed as patio homes at approximately 8.02 to 8.08 units per acre. The maximum density of units would be 50. One other conditions agreed upon with the neighbors would be to provide a twenty foot setback from the property block wall line to the nearest patio home that was proposed along the eastern edge of the development. Mr. Gronauer felt he had the support of the majority of the neighborhood for the revised plan and they understood the concept of a buffer between commercial and single family uses. He felt the patio homes provided that buffer and were well accepted by the neighbors. Mr. Gronauer ensured Council it was the intention of the developer and the property owners to build the product. He stated the owners and the proposed developer would be entering into a deed restriction on the property which would limit the amount of homes constructed to fifty patio one story units pursuant to the agreement reached with the neighbors.

Mayor Montandon stated that Item Nos. 3, 4, 5, and 6 were related and asked members of the public who wished to speak on the items to speak on all four items at once.

<u>Jewell Daniels, 4939 Clear Summit Lane, North Las Vegas</u>, spoke in opposition to the project stating there was no need for additional commercial developments in the area. She

stated medium density was too high for the area and it would create additional traffic.

Randy Rogas, 4846 Windbreak Lane, North Las Vegas, spoke in support of the project. He felt the project was well suited to the location and with the impending construction of the beltway, the area would be commercial at some point. He was appreciative that the developer would keep the residential portion to single story and felt it was the best use of the property. Mayor Montandon asked if the single family homes surrounding the development were single family. Mr. Rogas responded they were.

Jon I. Wright, 4821 Windbreak Lane, North Las Vegas, spoke in support of the project and stated he was impressed with the cooperation of the developers and the owners of the project to meet the needs of the neighbors. He felt they had done everything the neighbors had asked them to do and felt the development was a perfect fit for the location.

<u>Mary Herdt, 4826 Windbreak Lane, North Las Vegas</u>, spoke in support of the project. She stated she walked the neighborhood and spoke to the residents asking for support of the project. Most agreed that project was good for the area.

<u>L. J. Gibson, 4620 Steeplechase Avenue, North Las Vegas</u>, stated he bought his house partially because the area was zoned single family residential. He was opposed to the project because of the additional traffic multi-family residential would cause.

Councilwoman Smith asked if the project was in fact multi-family or detached single family homes. Mr. Gronauer responded the patios would be attached on two units with some single patios and all units would be single family. Councilwoman Smith then questioned how the conditions agreed to by the neighbors would be put into effect. Mr. Gronauer stated those conditions could be placed in the deed restriction including the unit maximum of 50 single story units, the closest setback for the adjacent property line to the east would be 20 feet, which would be the building itself.

Councilman Buck stated she had been in contact with the neighbors and they were very pleased with the meetings with the developers and owners and that Dayside Inc. was willing to address their concerns. She then asked where the landscaping would be placed.

<u>Bob Sharp, 1701 West Charleston, Las Vegas</u>, represented Dayside, Inc. and stated early in the negotiations with the neighborhood, the developers had agreed to 24-inch box trees in the 20 foot separation area between the single family homes.

Mayor Montandon asked staff if the tentative map would come back to the Planning Commission or would be reviewed by staff. Development Services Director Tom Bell stated if they filed a tentative map it would be reviewed by the Planning Commission.

Councilman Eliason requested the meandering sidewalks remain a part of the development. Mayor Montandon stated that requirement was part of the design standards.

City Attorney McGowan stated the ordinance was introduced in the anticipation of the development of the first phase of the 7,500 acres which was successfully bid to the North Valley Enterprises Group with whom the City was negotiating a master development agreement as well as consideration of a general master plan. The ordinance would create

a zoning category within which the City could consider the master development agreement when presented as well as the development plan from North Valley Enterprises, or any other successful bidder on the subsequent phases. The ordinance enabled the City to treat large developments differently in the event the City perceived different benefits and value to the City as compared to smaller planned unit developments. Robert Gronauer, attorney for North Valley Enterprises, proposed an amendment to the City that had been reviewed by the City Attorney's Office. It was determined by the City Attorney's Office to be substantially the same ordinance as was introduced on October 3, 2001.

Robert Gronauer 3800 Howard Hughes Parkway, Las Vegas, stated he had been working with staff, and the City Attorney's Office with respect to the ordinance. Mr. Gronauer concurred with the City Attorney's opinion that the ordinance and amendment were substantively similar in nature. He felt the ordinance amendment would benefit not only North Valley Enterprises but subsequent developers who were interested in the master planned community concept.

Councilman Buck asked the City Attorney if the ordinance amendment contained any language that would be a detriment to the City. City Attorney McGowan stated there was not.

Ana Freitas suggested a deposit program to help the City clean up glass. She then stated she was told there was a shortage of tetanus for vaccines. Ms. Freitas then complained about the pig farm odor. Councilman Buck asked staff to check whether the odor was disclosed to potential home owners.

Brother David Buer urged Council to act quickly regarding the homeless situation. He stated the number of homeless living on the streets had risen due to the closing of the Salvation Army shelter. He urged Council to allow the MASH tent to open prior to December 15<sup>th</sup>.

Mike Thomas spoke of pending arbitration and impending lawsuits.

John Armstrong asked Council to take arbitration seriously.

Mike Winne questioned the policy regarding police officers who commit crimes.
