24. STATUS REPORT ON THE PROGRESS OF THE PARKS AND RECREATION MASTER PLAN DEVELOPMENT. (TABLED FROM MARCH 5, 2003)

Chris Attanasio, Director of Landscape Architecture with Poggemeyer Design Group, Inc., stated he would provide Staff and Council a status update on the Park and Recreation Master Plan. The City's current Park and Recreation Master Plan completed in 1996 needed to be updated because of the shortage of park land. An updated plan would better suit the changes of the City and allow the City to apply for regional, state, and federal grant money. The City had experienced rapid population growth since 1996, expanded its boundaries with the addition of Aliante, and was becoming ethnically and culturally diverse.

Mr. Attanasio stated the planning process for the update would occur in three phases: a finding phase, a visioning phase and implementation phase. The finding phase would consist of park inventories, public orientation and workshops. The visioning phase would include formulation of the plan's goals and objectives. Park surveys would be conducted. The implementation phase would study financial feasibility and ultimately adoption of the plan. The eight month project was approximately 50% complete. The finding phase would be completed during the current month. All City parks had been inventoried. The visioning phase would be completed at the end of April and the implementation phase completed at the end of June. The expected outcome would be adoption of the plan as part of the Comprehensive Plan. Means of funding the plan would be presented to the Council. A five-year Capital Improvement Plan for parkland acquisition and recreational facility development would also be prepared.

Mr. Attanasio added two informational workshops had been held with two more planned for the future. Public notices and press releases would be supplied for all meetings and the information would be available on the City's web site. The web site information included an online public survey. The plan's outline would be part of the City's newsletter and provided at the future workshops.

<u>David Rehfeld, Landscape Architecture and Planner with Poggemeyer Design Group,</u> stated Parks and Recreation was not just a single Council priority but was interrelated to other Council priorities as well. City parks represented planned and quality growth and could be instrumental in the successful redevelopment and revitalization of their surrounding locations. An attractive park system could motivate business relocation and expansion.

Mr. Rehfeld stated during the previous workshops people had voiced their interest in parkland availability and recreational facilities. The City had upgraded two existing parks, Petiti Park and Prentiss Walker Park but upgrades could be targeted for Cheyenne Sports Complex, City View Park, Valley View Park and at least two small neighborhood parks. The City currently spent more per acre on park and grounds maintenance than other area cities which raised the issue of whether a future satellite park maintenance facility in the northwest area could be considered. The level of maintenance standards for mature parks would also be questioned.

The City had continued to progress in the creation of new parks. Five new parks totaling nearly 28 acres and the construction of the Silver Mesa Recreation Center had been constructed since 1997 but a shortage of community parks existed. A shortage of sports fields also existed. These issues would determine whether the City should continue to develop more neighborhood parks, concentrate on creating more community parks, or focus on building new recreation centers. Mr. Rehfeld stated the City was two recreation centers behind the current population count for 2003.

The surveys collected from the previous public workshops showed the citizens desired different forms of recreation, such as skateboard and water play parks, dog exercise areas and community gardens. The surveys also showed citizens were interested in extraordinary recreation possibilities including disc golf, bacce ball courts, creative "adventure" playgrounds, roller hockey and an amphitheater.

Mr. Rehfeld stated the City had partnered with the Clark County School District and that partnership had created five neighborhood parks in the City but these sites offered limited public access to both the grounds and recreational facilities because the parks were part of school sites. The plan would examine all available and underutilized school sites to determine the potential for future joint projects.

The City had a 160 acre regional park but the site was a model airplane flying facility. The City would have a model site for a regional park if it were able to acquire the Craig Ranch Golf Course.

Mr. Rehfeld stated the City had made tremendous strides with linear parks with the

development of 70 acres of natural open space in Aliante and aiding in the regional strategy for preservation and restoration of the Las Vegas Wash.

The shortage of different types of parks raised additional issues. The City could explore large acreage regional parks or possibly concentrate on creating downtown orientated parks. Multiple options existed and would be explored.

Mr. Rehfeld stated his firm would provide the City with a prioritized list of possible projects. A five-year Capital Improvement Program would be included in the package. He added many available funding sources existed through federal and state sources. In addition, a funding source could be utilized by General Obligation Bond funds, a parkland dedication ordinance, real estate transfer tax or utility surcharges.

Mr. Rehfeld stated the plan could possibly be presented to Council as soon as June or July and the plan would be periodically updated and revised to represent any change in the population growth of the City, urban development, or opportunities for funding sources.

Councilman Buck stated the City had not made significant progress in the development of parks. She asked Mr. Attanasio and Mr. Rehfeld to investigate the Public Lands Act as a funding source and to concentrate on City View Park as it was an underutilized park. Councilman Buck stated residents near the Lois Craig Elementary School had requested an area for their children to play because the school was unaccessible to the neighborhood children.

Mayor Pro Tempore Robinson stated it was imperative to seek available Public Lands Act funds.

Councilwoman Smith stated the City had made parks a priority and the City had made great progress in the area over the last five years.

Mayor Montandon stated the investment the City made in the Silver Mesa Recreation Center was well worth the \$11 million spent on the project.

Councilman Eliason questioned if the study included eliminating or combining park districts. Mr. Rehfeld replied no, consolidation of park districts would not be included in the study. City Manager Fritsch stated Staff was waiting for the Council's thoughts regarding changes in the park districts.

The final maps would not be approved by the Planning Commission for at least two weeks due to delay from Mr. Combs' appeal. His client was willing to work with Mr. Combs regarding the single story home issue. Mr. Gronauer stated if single story homes were built along El Campo Grande Avenue it would affect the aesthetics of the development. He stated when El Campo Grande Avenue was fully developed there would be a separation distance of approximately 90 feet from the development and Mr. Combs' property.

Councilman Eliason asked if Beazer Homes had a percentage of the single story homes which would be built. Mr. Gronauer answered 15% of the homes were planned as single story.

Councilman Buck asked Mr. Baxter if the City's design guidelines would be violated if the City required all single story homes to be built along El Campo Grande Avenue. Mr. Baxter stated yes, different models would be used to break up the monotony of the development. He added the developer could possibly agree to building as many single story homes as possible while adhering to the design guidelines. Councilman Buck questioned if the issue of single story homes had been addressed while the plan was in the tentative stage, could the plan had been revised to only single story homes. Mr. Baxter stated yes, the issue could have been resolved at that time.
