AN APPEAL SUBMITTED BY GEORGE GEKAKIS, PROPERTY OWNER WITHIN 300 FEET, OF THE DECISION OF THE PLANNING COMMISSION TO APPROVE UN-03-04; AN APPLICATION SUBMITTED BY SIMMONS ASSOCIATES, LLC, PROPERTY OWNER, FOR AN EXTENSION OF TIME TO A PREVIOUSLY APPROVED USE PERMIT IN A C-1 NEIGHBORHOOD COMMERCIAL DISTRICT TO ALLOW THE "ON SALE" OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES IN CONJUNCTION WITH A TAVERN ON PROPERTY GENERALLY LOCATED SOUTH OF LAKE MEAD BOULEVARD AND APPROXIMATELY 225 FEET EAST OF SIMMONS STREET.

Mayor Montandon opened the Public Hearing.

Planning and Development Director Jory Stewart stated the Planning Commission voted, on March 9, 2005, to approve the extension of time on a Special Use Permit to allow the "on sale" of alcoholic beverages. Since the original approval by the Planning Commission, the ordinance regarding separation of taverns from schools and churches was revised to require a tavern to be a minimum of 1500 feet from a school or church. Since there was an elementary school within the 1500 limit, the Planning Commission decision was being appealed.

In response to a question posed by Councilman Buck, Director Stewart stated when the tavern was originally approved by the Planning Commission, it was subject to the old ordinance. However, the applicant was applying for an extension of time for Council to consider new changes to the new code, such as increasing separation requirements or construction of a church, park or school that was not there previously. Councilman Buck asked City Attorney Sean McGowan for a legal opinion to which he responded it was up to Council to decide whether to apply the old rules to the application or to follow the rules in the revised code.

Mayor Pro Tempore Robinson asked if the "grandfather clause" applied to this application and City Attorney McGowan responded it would be at Council's discretion whether or not to apply the previous code or the new code to this item.

Bob Gronauer, 3800 Howard Hughes Parkway, Las Vegas, represented the applicant and stated the Special Use Permit was previously approved and the request was for an extension of time to ascertain if any significant changes had been made to determine if the Use Permit would no longer be compatible in the area. Mr. Gronauer stated if the applicant were not grandfathered in by the original ordinance, he would not be permitted to request an extension of time.

When questioned further by Councilman Buck, City Attorney McGowan explained as long as the Use Permit was current, it would be grandfathered in by the previous tavern ordinance. However, once the Use Permit expired, it would be null and void unless granted an extension of time by Council. Councilman Buck asked when the Use Permit expired and was told by Director Stewart it would expire if the extension of time were not approved.

George Gekakis, 2655 South Rainbow Boulevard, Las Vegas, owner of Whispering Palms Senior Apartments, 2655 W. Lake Mead Boulevard, North Las Vegas, inquired as to when the tavern zoning ordinance was approved. Director Stewart replied it was approved on January 14, 2004. He asked if the applicant had applied for a building permit and business license to which Mayor Montandon responded they had not. Mr. Gekakis stated he disagreed with the City Attorney's comments that the applicant was grandfathered in by the previous ordinance. He did not believe a tavern was a compatible use for the area. He submitted a petition signed by 281 residents opposing the 24-hour tavern. Councilman Eliason pointed out the item was approved a year ago and Mr. Gekakis stated he did not receive a Public Hearing Notice. He stated he was opposed to a 24-hour tavern.

Director Stewart reiterated it was at Council's discretion whether or not to approve the applicant's request for an extension of time. She stated Staff's recommendation to the Planning Commission was for approval and the Planning Commission did vote to approve the extension of time on March 9, 2005.

Mayor Pro Tempore Robinson suggested the item be continued for further clarification. Mr. Gronauer requested the opportunity to speak with the residents of Whispering Palms to discuss with them the many restrictions imposed on the applicant. Mr. Gekakis stated he was agreeable to a continuance of 45 days.

Councilman Buck requested Staff check into why the residents were not notified of the Public Hearing.

Councilman Buck agreed with Mr. Gronauer's statement that lot size was not the issue but design was more important when constructing a residence. Director Stewart stated an analysis was being conducted by Staff to determine what type of products could be developed on a 50-foot wide R-1 lot.
