2. AMP-18-05 (CRAIG ROAD CONDOMINIUMS); AN APPLICATION SUBMITTED BY CRAIG ROAD, LLC, PROPERTY OWNER, FOR AN AMENDMENT TO THE COMPREHENSIVE PLAN, LAND USE ELEMENT, TO CHANGE THE CURRENT DESIGNATION OF INDUSTRIAL TO HDR HIGH DENSITY RESIDENTIAL FOR PROPERTY LOCATED AT THE SOUTHWEST CORNER OF VANDENBERG LANE AND CRAIG ROAD. (ASSOCIATED ITEM NO. 3, APPEAL, ZN-35-05) (CONTINUED JUNE 1 AND JUNE 15, 2005)

Mayor Montandon opened the Public Hearing.

Planning Manager Marc Jordan stated the site was located adjacent to a residential development within the Clark County District. The Planning Commission unanimously recommended approval.

<u>George Garcia, 1711 Whitney Mesa Drive, Suite 110, Henderson, represented the applicant and concurred with Staff's conditions.</u>

<u>Zuzana Herchik, 4106 Pistachio Nut Avenue, Las Vegas,</u> stated she was opposed to the proposed re-zoning. Ms. Herchik inquired as to the status of the vacation of Vandenberg Lane. Mr. Garcia responded a traffic study was conducted and the results were provided to the Public Works Department.

<u>Peter Herchik, 4106 Pistachio Nut Avenue, Las Vegas,</u> spoke in opposition to the proposed High Density Residential designation.

Renee Albert, 4111 Pistachio Nut Avenue, Las Vegas, stated she was in favor of the property designation of High Density Residential. However, she expressed concern over the safety of the children due to high traffic and would like to see Macadamia Drive closed off at Vandenberg Lane. When asked by Ms. Albert about the design review, Mayor Montandon responded the design review could not be completed before the zoning of the property.

Councilwoman Smith expressed concern that if the zoning change were approved, the issue of the vacation of Vandenberg Lane would still be an issue. She suggested the Vandenberg vacation be discussed and decided upon prior to the zoning change.

George Garcia commented if the property were zoned industrial or commercial, the traffic problem would be worse than if it were zoned residential because of the trucks and commercial vehicles that would come through the area.

6. AN APPEAL BY CHRISTOPHER R. MCCULLOUGH, REPRESENTING THE MELDRUM FAMILY TRUST, PROPERTY OWNER, OF THE PLANNING COMMISSION'S DECISION TO APPROVE SPR-18-05 (5TH AND GILMORE BUSINESS PARK); AN APPLICATION SUBMITTED BY MARTIN HARRIS CONSTRUCTION, ON BEHALF OF THE MELDRUM FAMILY TRUST, PROPERTY OWNER, FOR A SITE PLAN REVIEW IN AN M-2 GENERAL INDUSTRIAL DISTRICT TO DEVELOP 10 BUILDINGS WITH 232,801 SQUARE FEET OF OFFICE AND WAREHOUSE SPACE ON PROPERTY LOCATED AT THE NORTHEAST CORNER OF GOWAN ROAD AND NORTH 5TH STREET.

Mayor Montandon opened the Public Hearing.

Planning Manager Marc Jordan advised Staff recommended approval by the Planning Commission subject to the following conditions:

- 1. Unless expressly authorized through a variance, waiver or another method, development shall comply with all applicable codes and ordinances.
- 2. The development must comply with the Industrial Design Guidelines.
- 3. The slope at the rear and sides of the property line must not exceed three to one (3:1) and must be terraced using two or more retaining walls, that shall not exceed six feet in height, for a maximum overall height of twelve feet.
- 4. A master sign plan shall be submitted and approved for the entire development prior to the issuance of a building permit for a sign.

The Planning Commission unanimously approved the application subject to the addition of the following condition:

5. Dedication of right-of-way pursuant to Master Plan of Streets and Highways.

The applicant appealed the additional condition and the item was continued to allow the applicant to work with Staff regarding the project. The revised site plan showed 30 feet of landscaping next to North 5th Street which did not include the sidewalk. Manager Jordan stated Staff agreed with the dedication and advised the City would be able to acquire the additional 25 feet of landscaping sometime in the future. The additional 25 feet could eventually be designed with a 10-foot all-purpose trail and 10 feet of landscaping, in addition to the landscaping provided by the applicant adjacent to their own parking lot, which would be five feet. As a result, Staff drafted a revised Condition No. 5 which the applicant agreed to as follows:

"5. 30 feet of perimeter landscaping, not including sidewalks, shall be provided along North 5th Street. A minimum of five feet of perimeter landscaping outside of the public right-of-way shall be maintained along North 5th Street following any future right-of-way acquisition."

<u>James J. Leavitt, Kermit L. Waters Law Office, 704 South 9th Street, Las Vegas,</u> appeared on behalf of the applicant and recommended approval based upon the revised conditions. He offered to respond to questions.

<u>Vegas</u>, stated the applicant had curbs and gutters installed on North 5th Street which would be modified as the project moved forward. He advised there was a bus turnout on the property and the applicant planned to have discussions with Public Works as to whether the bus turnout was needed or if it could be relocated.

Public Works Director Jim Bell stated the future street design of 5th Street had not been completed but was a future condition. The right-of-way was previously dedicated since the applicant had a prior subdivision in the area. Director Bell advised it was not yet certain how the bus turnout would be incorporated into the revised section of North 5th Street and that determination could not be made without the future street design.

Councilwoman Smith made it matter of record that she was personally acquainted with the applicant, Floyd Meldrum, but it would not affect her decision.

24. <u>ACCEPTANCE OF THE UPDATE PRESENTATION FOR THE DESIGN OF THE CIVIC CENTER DRIVE MEDIAN XERISCAPE PROJECT.</u>

Senior Engineer Bill Knight provided an update of the Civic Center Xeriscape project which had progressed to the final design stage. The existing turf would be replaced with tiered planters and drought-tolerant trees, shrubs and ground cover. The existing planters would be removed and the existing olive trees would be incorporated in a larger planter with larger trees. The existing pedestrian crossing would remain intact, as well as space for the City's annual Tastes 'n Tunes event. Mr. Knight advised there would be one change in the original design and that was for the first tier of the medians from the back of curb to the first wall. Ground cover was originally planned but due to concern for the safety of the Parks Maintenance staff, as well as increased wear and tear, decorative concrete or paver would be used. He estimated construction would begin approximately January 1, 2006 with a completion date of approximately the end of April, in time for the 2006 Tastes 'n Tunes event. Mr. Knight advised the City would be eligible for a reimbursement of \$50,000 from the Southern Nevada Water Authority for eliminating the existing turf.

Councilman Eliason expressed a desire to have palm trees included in the Civic Center landscape project. He stated a theme had been established with palm trees included in other landscape projects throughout the City and felt it should be consistent.

Mr. Knight advised Staff had considered palm trees as a potential option and suggested the addition of California date palms at the points of the islands. He proposed a total of eighteen 20-foot date palm trees for an additional cost of approximately \$54,000. Another option would be eighteen 20-foot Canary Island date palms at an approximate cost of

between \$72,000 and \$108,000. A third option was offered which would be thirty 20-foot Washingtonian fan palms at a cost of \$24,000. Mr. Knight explained 12-13% more water would be required with the addition of the palm trees.

Mr. Knight commented that Staff was concerned about the significant height of the existing sycamore and other mature trees in front of City Hall. He stated the 20-foot trees planted in the medians could possibly lose their visual impact with the tall trees on the City Hall campus.

Councilwoman Smith expressed concern that the visual impact the palms would produce may be diminished by the taller trees on the City Hall campus. She also stated the landscape project was geared to conserving water and if palm trees were placed in the medians, it would defeat that purpose.

City Attorney McGowan advised AB 341, referred to in three instances in the ordinance, should have read AB 384. He also suggested an amendment be included to address the sale or transfer of existing licenses.

<u>Richard Jacobs, 1590 East Sahara Avenue, Las Vegas,</u> thanked Council for amending the moratorium ordinance. He asked that his association be included in further discussions with Council and City Staff regarding the moratorium.

<u>Las Vegas</u>, spoke in support of the proposed moratorium and the new legislation. He felt the moratorium would be longer than six months due to the length of time it would take a new company to complete all the licensing requirements. He stated the moratorium addressed primarily deferred deposits but check-cashing facilities offered a wide variety of other services.

ACTION: AMENDMENT APPROVED AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1, MORATORIUM. The City Council of the City of North Las Vegas does hereby declare a moratorium prohibiting the filing or acceptance of land use applications or business license applications for new financial institutions offering deferred deposit services as defined by the not yet codified AB 384. Sale or transfer of existing licensed business operations is permitted as long as all state and local licensing requirements are satisfied. This moratorium shall act as provided above from the effective date of the ordinance until the close of business six months from the effective date of this ordinance, unless rules and regulations pertaining to financial institutions offering deferred deposit services are earlier adopted.
