Mayor Montandon opened the Public Hearing.

Planning and Zoning Manager Marc Jordan advised the Planning Commission recommended approval for medium density residential.

Bob Gronauer, 3800 Howard Hughes Parkway, Las Vegas, appeared on behalf of the applicant and stated the property was adjacent to the Union Pacific Railroad and surrounded by approved single-family detached residential development. Mr. Gronauer explained the entire area had originally been master planned for industrial and commercial uses. However, since that time there had been a significant change in the area to residential development and he did not feel it was now appropriate for industrial use. Because of the location of the property adjacent to the railroad tracks, as well as the shape and size of the property, Mr. Gronauer felt the development of single-family detached homes would not be feasible. It was his opinion that multi-family development would be a good buffer for the residential in the area. Mr. Gronauer advised the density would be approximately 16 dwelling units per acre and, although that would be considered high density, he felt it would be more medium-high density. Mr. Gronauer requested Council approve the project for medium-high or high density.

Regarding the issue of traffic and access to and from the project, Mr. Gronauer stated he

met with Public Works Staff to address these concerns. Several solutions were considered, including calming devices and landscaped islands to control the traffic. A secondary access was considered for an emergency access crash gate that would not be used for regular traffic.

Mayor Montandon noted the current site plan did not show the required 240-foot setback from the central property line and would be discussed during the site plan review process. Discussions would also be held regarding the number of units that could safely exit from one crash gate. Mayor Montandon supported the Planning Commission's recommendation of medium density which would accommodate 13 units per acre or 70+ total units.

Mr. Gronauer was concerned that with a medium density configuration, after meeting the open space and buffering requirements, the project would only produce 10-11 units per acre. He suggested Council consider approval for medium-high density.

In response to a question by Mayor Montandon, Manager Jordan stated medium-high density would accommodate up to 13 units per acre and medium density would provide up to 10 units per acre. He advised if medium-high density were approved, the applicant would have to come back with a Planned Unit Development (PUD) since the R-3 proposal requested would not be consistent with the Comprehensive Plan.

There were also two other businesses at the same location which she believed to be a pawn shop and a payday loan company which were legally licensed.

City Attorney Sean McGowan confirmed the pawn shop referred to by Mayor Montandon was not the same pawn shop located on the subject property.

Adam Gentile, Member/Manager, Hachiman, LLC, the applicant, explained there were two buildings on the property. The Satin Saddle was in one building and the Palomino Club and Lacy's shared a common wall.

When asked by Councilwoman Smith, Ms. Janssen stated Adam Gentile was the 100% Member/Manager of Hachiman, LLC.

<u>Dominic Gentile, 3960 Howard Hughes Parkway, Las Vegas</u>, advised he was the 100% shareholder of Dominic P. Gentile, Ltd. dba Gentile DiPalma. Bermuda Sands was an LLC and was the record owner of the land on which the businesses were located. The property was previously solely owned by Luis Hidalgo who transferred 100% of his shares in the LLC to Dominic Gentile's law firm.

In response to a question by Councilman Eliason, Adam Gentile stated he did not intend to allow Luis Hidalgo to enter the premises.

Public Works Director Jim Bell advised Staff recommended that Meadow Valley Contractors, the low bidder, be awarded the bid.

Mayor Montandon explained there were certain procedures that had to be followed in the City's bid process and certain criteria were required of the bidders. He stated the proper bidding procedures were followed and the project was awarded to the bidder who met the required criteria.

<u>Jim Winkler, 3690 Howard Hughes Parkway #300, Las Vegas,</u> represented Meadow Valley Contractors, Inc. and offered to respond to questions.

Steve Holloway, Executive Vice President, Associated General Contractors, 150 North Durango Drive, Las Vegas, advised Meadow Valley Contractors, Inc. had been a member in good standing of the Associated General Contractors (AGC) for many years, as well as a member of the Self-Insured Worker's Compensation Group. As a member of that group, Meadow Valley was required to maintain a very good safety record and a low number of worker's compensation claims.

Mr. Holloway also advised the AGC employed a labor staff to negotiate and administer approximately 10 master labor agreements for different building trades. Included in the administration of the labor agreements was the monitoring of prevailing wages to level the playing fields between union and non-union companies. Mr. Holloway was in support of the project being awarded to Meadow Valley Contractors, Inc.

Robert Terril, 1735 Whipple Avenue, Logandale, spoke on behalf of Meadow Valley Contractors and stated his company had completed many high-profile projects in Nevada with great success. He stated the Carpenters' Union tried to organize the Meadow Valley workers but were not successful. He read an affidavit from Brad Larsen, President and Chief Executive Officer of Meadow Valley Contractors, in which Mr. Larsen stated Meadow Valley was being coerced by the Carpenters' Union to join their labor group.

Norm Watkins, 490 Esau Angelo, Gilbert, Arizona, stated he was an employee of Meadow Valley Contractors in Phoenix, Arizona for 17 years. One of his duties was that of Safety Director and he advised the lost time frequency rate of Meadow Valley was 66% below the industry average for serious injuries and had an experience modification rating of 32% below the industry average. Mr. Watkins read a letter from Warren B. Hardy II, President of Associated Builders and Contractors of Las Vegas (ABC), endorsing Meadow Valley Contractors.

<u>James Roletti, 7365 Prairie Falcon Road, Suite 120, Las Vegas,</u> spoke on behalf of the Carpenters/Contractors Cooperation Committee (C/CCC) and was opposed to Meadow Valley Contractors being awarded the Ann Road project contract. He presented a letter of protest from the C/CCC which stated their objections to Meadow Valley Contractors, Inc. The letter made several allegations against Meadow Valley, including wage and safety violations. Mr. Roletti requested that Council find Meadow Valley a non-responsible contractor and award the contract to the second low bidder.

Mayor Montandon questioned the allegation that employees of Meadow Valley were underpaid when there were so many contracting job opportunities in Nevada. Mr. Roletti responded the employees accepted the underpayment because they wanted to keep their jobs.

In response to a question by Mayor Montandon, Mr. Roletti stated this was not a union versus non-union issue.

Desmond Lee, 533 South Fremont Avenue, Los Angeles, California, represented the Carpenters/Contractors Cooperation Committee (C/CCC) and stated, in response to the question posed by Mayor Montandon, many construction workers were immigrant laborers who had no idea what the prevailing wage was and, therefore, did not know they were being underpaid. He felt by underpaying their workers, Meadow Valley was saving money and consequently could come in with the low bid on a project. Mr. Lee stated he was present at the meeting to prevent the circumvention of the competitive bidding process and to ensure that Meadow Valley could not take unfair advantage of the process by cheating.

Mr. Lee went on to say he had information concerning improper and unethical conduct by City of North Las Vegas Public Works Director Jim Bell in connection with his advocacy of Meadow Valley in his capacity as a private citizen. He stated Mr. Bell was associated with the Associated General Contractors (AGC) and chaired a public works committee where he met with other local municipalities. Mr. Lee alleged that Mr. Bell invited representatives of Meadow Valley to one of the committee meetings and "bad mouthed" the C/CCC and attempted to solicit letters of recommendation from the agencies in attendance. He requested the City check into the allegations to ensure the bid process and the City's image were preserved.

<u>Cristobal Corona, 3130 Holmes Circle, North Las Vegas,</u> presented a petition with more than 300 signatures of North Las Vegas citizens opposed to the contract for the Ann Road project being awarded to Meadow Valley Contractors.

<u>James Sala, 501 North Lamb Boulevard, Las Vegas,</u> represented the Southwest Regional Council of Carpenters and submitted a letter with a synopsis of complaints against Meadow Valley Contractors, along with pictures of alleged safety violations. Mr. Sala recommended the contract not be awarded to Meadow Valley Contractors.

Mr. Sala also complained that City employees had removed Carpenters' Union signs from public and private property and he provided a photograph of Code Enforcement officers with the signs in their possession. He suggested the award of the contract be postponed until some of the issues had been resolved between the City and the Carpenters' Union.

In response to a question by Mayor Pro Tempore Robinson, Robert Terril stated Meadow Valley was incorporated in the state of Nevada in 1980.

Mayor Pro Tempore Robinson felt the bid process was handled fairly and equitably and the issue should not involve union versus non-union issues.

Councilman Buck expressed her dissatisfaction with the comments made about the City and the Public Works Director. She also stated she recognized three signatures on the

petition submitted by Mr. Corona as those of 17-year-old females and questioned what purpose there was in seeking teenagers to petition against a contracting company. Councilman Buck felt the bid process was handled fairly and equitably and supported the award of the contract to Meadow Valley.

Councilwoman Smith advised she was a union member and respected the issues brought forward; however, she felt those issues were not proven to be substantive enough to reject Meadow Valley as the award recipient.

Councilwoman Smith disclosed that her husband was employed by one of the rejected bidding companies but her vote would not be affected.

Parks and Recreation Director Mike Henley provided an overview of the results of the teen feasibility study conducted by Lucchesi, Galati Architects, Inc. Demographically, ages 12-19 were surveyed which represented approximately 16% of the City's population but this percentage was expected to decrease over time. It was determined that teenagers spend 73% of their time "hanging out with friends" and their time was programmed from early morning to evening.

Recreationally, most teens expressed an interest in traditional sports, such as swimming and basketball. There was also a growing interest in extreme sports, such as in-line

skating, snow boarding and BMX riding.

Socially, 61% were interested in concerts and music and it was also noted 27% expressed an interest in volunteer programs.

In response to a question by Councilman Buck, 500 North Las Vegas adolescents were surveyed, plus focus groups.

Director Henley advised most teens tended to rely on school programs for educational skills but they desired to have the City offer life skill development programs, such as job-seeking skills, music education, homework tutoring, environmental education and anger management education.

Director Henley stated all teens were viewed to be at risk due to peer pressure and the survey revealed the majority of the respondents wanted to act responsibly and make good life choices. He advised the Parks and Recreation Board wanted to get more involved in this issue and also get the community involved.

The demographics for the senior study included ages 45 and up. Director Henley advised that 28% of the North Las Vegas population was over 55 and the number was growing significantly. Citizens who lived two miles outside the City were also surveyed because they visited the Neighborhood Recreation Center on a regular basis.

Director Henley commented the seniors in North Las Vegas were very active and walking was the number one senior activity. When questioned about activities they would like to take part in, all of the respondents stated they would like to see more music-oriented activities, such as concerts. Most seniors did not seek educational activities at parks and community centers; however, those that did were interested in computer studies, self-improvement and health, nutrition and safety courses.

Director Henley stated the intent of the program was to continue to provide quality teen and senior services throughout the City system. He advised there was an information referral network in the County of non-profit and public agencies to which citizens could be referred for available services.

Director Henley recommended a non-traditional recreation center to promote wellness and quality of life through the provision of cultural, social and educational wellness opportunities for all age groups. He stated aquatic facilities were very important and recommended the development of aquatic programs such as physical therapy, lap swimming, water aerobics, competitions and swimming lessons.

Director Henley advised three sites were considered for the new facility and it was recommended the 40-acre site at Centennial Parkway and Rome Boulevard be selected.

The plan was to erect a 40,000 square-foot facility comparable to the Silver Mesa Recreational Center.

Director Henley requested Council acceptance of the findings of the teen/senior study, support for a multi-generational center, support for the Centennial/Rome site and direction to Staff to move forward with a contract for design of the next phase.
