13. DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION REGARDING THE EXECUTION OF A PROFESSIONAL SERVICE AGREEMENT WITH THE BUXTON COMPANIES IN THE AMOUNT OF \$110,000 TO DEVELOP RETAIL ATTRACTION AND EXPANSION PLANS FOR THE CITY. (CNLV CONTRACT NO. C-6422)

Amy Wetzel-Buxton, Vice President - Western Region - Buxton Company, 2651 South Polaris Drive, Fort Worth, TX, stated retail development was a viable and vital part of a city's overall economic development. She stated Buxton Company would offer solutions to uncover retail and restaurant opportunities for the City.

Ms. Wetzel-Buxton stated in sixty business days or less the City would be able to market potential retailers. The first step to accomplish this goal would be to determine the length of drive time to the retail area, since consumers enjoyed convenience. The next step would be to identify the trade area to determine which retailers would be successful with a particular type of consumer base. She stated Buxton Company would offer a premium service because they had a staff of almost 150 employees and a large volume of data to aid in making wise decisions for the City.

Councilman Eliason asked Ms. Wetzel-Buxton to explain the difference between a market study by Buxton Company and a developer's market study. Ms. Wetzel-Buxton responded there were different types of market studies; however, Buxton Company utilized a customer study which would identify customers based on their buying habits.

Councilman Eliason asked City Manager Rose how a customer study would tie in with the Comprehensive Plan, since the Comprehensive Plan already contained an area for commercial development. City Manager Rose explained the customer study would provide guidance as to what type of commercial development would be best suited for an area based on the spending habits of the residents.

Councilman Eliason asked City Manager Rose how the City would benefit from a customer study when it was the developers who had the land available. City Manager Rose responded the City would work as a facilitator between the developers and the retailers. He explained the City would be able to target a particular type of retail based upon the buying habits of the residents.

<u>David Glover, Chief Financial Officer, Buxton Company, 2651 South Polaris Drive, Forth</u> <u>Worth, TX</u>, stated retailers would be offered information on the potential for business in various locations of North Las Vegas.

Councilman Eliason asked Mr. Glover how often the customer study needed to be updated, and he responded it should be evaluated in 12-18 months to determine if an update was needed.

Councilman Eliason stated large corporations have a marketing staff for obtaining data on current market conditions for a potential retail area. City Manager Rose stated the City would augment the data of large corporations and would also be able to provide small businesses with data.

Mayor Montandon stated data regarding market conditions would enable the City to counter negative statements intelligently. Councilwoman Smith agreed that statistical evidence of the City's retail potential would be a valuable tool.

Bob Borgersen, 7617 Island Rail, North Las Vegas, expressed disapproval since the City was growing so fast he felt a customer study was not needed. Councilwoman Smith stated data would be the link between the City's dream and reality.
